MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING

1. INTRODUCTION

The accreditation bodies of the nations in the American Region decided in November 1996 to create the Inter American Accreditation Cooperation (IAAC). In 2004, after the IAAC has been legally established, has bylaws and has a significant number of administrative, procedural and governance rules, it decided to update the Memorandum of Understanding by which it was established. When accepted, new members in all categories will henceforth sign this Memorandum of Understanding (MOU).

2. MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING

The accreditation bodies of the nations or bloc of nations in the American Region state their intention to be part of the Inter American Accreditation Cooperation, IAAC. These bodies are established and operate in accordance with the IAAC Bylaws, the IAAC Quality Manual and the rules established in this Memorandum of Understanding (MOU). Organizations in the nations or bloc of nations in the American Region that have the intention to establish and operate accreditation activities in accordance with the IAAC Bylaws, the IAAC Quality Manual and the rules established in this Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) are equally eligible to join the IAAC.

IAAC members agree to work to strengthen the principles established in accreditation and formally agree to employ the relevant guides and standards of the ISO/IEC and the mandatory documents of the International Accreditation Forum (IAF) and the International Laboratory Accreditation Cooperation (ILAC) in developing their programs.

3. MISSION, VISION AND QUALITY POLICY

IAAC's Goals, Mission, Vision and Quality Policy are described in the IAAC Quality Manual and in the IAAC Bylaws.

4. MEMBERSHIP

IAAC membership categories (full members, associate members and stakeholder members) as well as their rights and obligations are defined in the IAAC Bylaws.

5. IAAC GENERAL ASSEMBLY

The IAAC General Assembly rules, composition and its authority are described in the IAAC Bylaws.

6. IAAC EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE

The IAAC Executive Committee responsibilities, terms of reference, and composition as approved by the General Assembly, are defined in the Executive Committee's Terms of Reference.

7. MULTILATERAL RECOGNITION AGREEMENTS

Accreditation Bodies will demonstrate willingness to reach equivalence of operation of their accreditation system and their respective programs, which will result in a Multilateral Recognition Agreement, in accordance with IAAC Goals as described in the IAAC Bylaws.

8. VALIDITY OF THE MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING

8.1 This MOU may be amended by agreement of at least two-thirds (2/3) of the Full Members, provided that all Members have had two months advance notification, together with all corresponding information.

8.2 If a Member intends to terminate its participation in this MOU, it shall notify the IAAC Chair at least three months prior to the date of withdrawal.

8.3 Questions of interpretation of this MOU are to be resolved by the General Assembly.

8.4 The MOU will not create any legal obligation, but the signatories must implement it in good faith. The Members will retain autonomy in their own operations.
